Mental Health Component People with a serious mental illness who meet regular screening criteria may be eligible for placement in one of two Community Corrections programs: work release or electronic monitoring. Participants are closely monitored to make sure they are taking their prescribed medication and taking part in treatment.

Hepatitis C is nine to 10 times more prevalent in correctional facilities than in communities. Chronic health conditions, such as asthma and hypertension, and mental health disorders also affect prisoner populations at rates that far exceed their prevalence in the general population.
