The Eysenck Personality Questionnaire (EPQ) is a three dimensional personality assessment tool that was preceded by an overlapping two-dimensional measure called the Eysenck Personality Inventory (EPI). The EPI was developed by Hans and Sybil Eysenck [1] to measure the two broad dimensions of Extraversion-Introversion\* and Neuroticism-Stability. These two 24-item measures were supplemented by a 9-item Lie scale in an attempt to guard against various concerns about response style.

The Eysenck Personality Inventory (EPI) is a self-report instrument designed to measure two central dimensions of personality, extraversion and neuroticism. This instrument is comprised of 57 yes/no items and yields total scores for extraversion and neuroticism as well as a validity score (e.g., Lie Scale). Individuals are generally classified as "high" or "low" on the two dimensions.

### **The Eysenck Personality Profile in Selected Groups of ...**

Studies examining Eysenck's theory of criminality by contrasting delinquent and non-delinquent groups have produced equivocal results. Some studies have shown criminals to score higher, as the theory predicts, on psychoticism, neuroticism and extraversion, whilst other studies have not. The current study examines the theory from a new approach by using cluster analysis to demonstrate the heterogeneity of personality types in delinquent sample ( N =100) and in a comparison group ( N = 100).
