One strategy that teachers use is to vary the size of the group they teach to. Some lessons are taught to the whole class. Others are better for a small group of students or one student. Learning in a small group or one-on-one can be very helpful to kids with learning and thinking differences.

Strategies Teachers Use to Help Kids With Learning and ...

Reduce distractions in the student's work area (i.e., have the student remove extra pencils, books)
Divide work into smaller sections (i.e., have the student complete one section at a time; suggest times and expectations for completion) Ask the student to summarize information orally that has just been presented.

Set a "Cool Down" Zone. Many students who struggle with behavioral and emotional control can cope best by stepping away from the situation and cooling down. Make this practice possible for the child by establishing a preset "cool-down" zone for the child to visit when he needs to calm himself.

An effective teaching method is to demonstrate what you mean in addition to giving verbal directions. With new information shared verbally, also show a picture. And rather than just showing a picture, provide the student with hands-on materials and experiences and the opportunity to try things out. Go step by step.

Strategies for Teaching Students with Intellectual ...

Allow hearing-impaired students to sit where they think best, as sitting close to the teacher will help the child to better understand the context of your words by observing your facial expressions. Don't shout. If the child is already wearing an FM device, your voice will be amplified, as it is.

Establish Rules & Routines for ADHD Students. Post classroom rules for student with and without ADHD. With input from students, establish short, simple classroom rules. State them in positive ... For example, instead of saying: "No loud talking when you come into class," say, "When you come into ...

Teaching students with language impairments in the classroom entails identifying strengths and weaknesses to determine the appropriate implementation of student accommodations. Small groups with peer tutors aids language impaired students with challenging vocabulary and comprehension of text. A teacher can model proper use of language and try to prompt the learner with familiar vocabulary.

Ensure that organization, communication and sensory issues are addressed (see General Strategies and Classroom Checklist) Establish clear routines and habits to support regular activities and transitions. Alert the student to changes in routine, staffing, etc., in advance, whenever possible.
